Important Note for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts:

From Massachusetts Rules and Regulations 248 5.08:

- (a) For all side wall horizontally vented gas fueled equipment installed in every dwelling, building or structure used in whole or in part for residential purposes, including those owned or operated by the Commonwealth and where the side wall exhaust vent termination is less than seven (7) feet above finished grade in the area of the venting, including but not limited to decks and porches, the following requirements shall be satisfied.
- 1. INSTALLATION OF CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS. At the time of installation of the side wall horizontal vented gas fueled equipment, the installing plumber or gas fitter shall observe that a hard wired carbon monoxide detector with an alarm and battery back-up is installed on the floor level where the gas equipment is to be installed, in addition, the installing plumber or gas fitter shall observe that a battery operated or hard-wired carbon monoxide detector with an alarm is installed on each additional level of the dwelling, building or structure served by the side wall horizontal vented gas fueled equipment. It shall be the responsibility of the property owner to secure the services of qualified licensed professionals for the installation of hard-wired carbon monoxide detectors.
- a. In the event that the side wall horizontally vented gas fueled equipment is installed in a crawl space or an attic, the hardwired carbon monoxide detector with alarm and battery back-up may be installed on the next adjacent floor level.
- b. In the event that the requirements of this subdivision cannot be met at the time of completion of installation, the owner shall have a period of thirty (30) days to comply with the above requirements; provided, however, that during said thirty (30) day period, a battery operated carbon monoxide detector with an alarm shall be installed.
- 2. APPROVED CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS. Each carbon monoxide detector as required in accordance with the above provisions shall comply with NFPA 720 and be ANSI/UL 2034 listed as IAS certified.
- 3. SIGNAGE. A metal or plastic identification plate shall be permanently mounted to the exterior of the building at a minimum height of eight (8) feet above grade directly in line with the exhaust vent terminal for the horizontally vented gas fueled heating appliance or equipment. The sign shall read, in print size no less than one-half (1/2) inch in size, "GAS VENT DIRECTLY BELOW. KEEP CLEAR OF ALL OBSTRUCTIONS".
- 4. INSPECTION. The state or local gas inspector of the side wall horizontally vented gas fueled equipment shall not approve the installation unless, upon inspection, the inspector observes carbon monoxide detectors and signage installed in accor dance with the provisions of 248 CMR 5.089(2) (a) 1 through 4.
- (b) EXEMPTIONS. The following equipment is exempt from 248 CMR 5.089(2)(a) 1 through 4.
- 1. The equipment listed in Chapter 10 entitled "Equipment Not Required To Be Vented" in the most current edition of NFPA 54 as adopted by the Board; and
- 2. Product Approved side wall horizontal vented gas fueled equipment installed in a room or structure separate from the dwelling, building or structure used in whole or in part for residential purposes.
- (c) MANUFACTURER REQUIREMENTS GAS EQUIPMENT VENTING SYSTEM PROVIDED. When the manufacturer of Product Approved side wall horizontally vented gas equipment provides a venting system design or venting system components with the equipment, the instructions provided by the manufacturer for installation of the equipment and the venting system shall include:
- 1. Detailed instructions for the installation of the venting system design or the venting system components; and
- 2. A complete parts list for the venting system design or venting system.
- (d) MANUFACTURER REQUIREMENTS GAS EQUIPMENT VENTING SYSTEM NOT PROVIDED. When the manufacturer of a Product Approved side wall horizontally vented gas fueled equipment does not provide the parts for venting the fuel gases, but identifies "special venting systems", the following requirements shall be satisfied by the manufacturer.
- 1. The referenced "special venting system" instructions shall be included with the appliance or equipment installation instructions; and
- 2. The "special venting systems" shall be Product Approved by the Board, and the instructions for that system shall include a parts list and detailed installation instructions.
- (e) A copy of all installation instructions for all Product Approved side wall horizontally vented gas fueled equipment, all venting instructions, all parts lists for venting instructions, and/or all venting design instructions shall remain with the appliance or equipment at the completion of the installation.


This appliance and its individual shut off valve must be disconnected from gas supply piping system during any pressure testing of that system at test pressures in excess of 1/2 psig (3.5 kPa).

This appliance must be isolated from the gas supply piping system by closing its individual manual shut off valve during any pressure testing of the gas supply piping system at test pressures equal to or less than 1/2 psig (3.5 kPa).

Note: When lit for the first time, the appliance will emit a slight odour for a couple of hours. This is due to the curing of paints, sealants and lubricants used in the manufacturing process. This condition is temporary. Open doors and windows to ventilate area. Smoke and fumes caused by the curing process may cause discomfort to some individuals.

Do not use the fireplace if any part has been under water. Immediately call a qualified service technician to inspect the fireplace and to replace any part of the control system and any gas control which has been under water.

This fireplace is equipped with a micro mesh safety screen for your protection and must be installed with the unit. Removal of the safety screen will cause the fireplace to become a burn hazard.





- Due to high temperatures, this gas appliance should be located out of traffic and away from furniture and draperies.
- Children and adults should be alerted to the hazards of high surface temperatures and should stay away to avoid burns or clothing ignition.
- Young children should be carefully supervised when they are in the same room as the appliance. Toddlers, young children and others may be susceptible to accidental contact burns. A physical barrier is recommended if there are at risk individuals in the house. To restrict access to a fireplace or stove, install an adjustable safety gate to keep toddlers, young children and other at risk individuals out of the room and away from hot surfaces.




Figure 1: Tofino Dimensions.




Figure 2: Tofino Surround dimensions.



Existing Fireplace Preparation

Note: SIT controlled installations require that an electrical outlet be installed either into an existing fireplace cavity before the Tofino is installed, or alternatively, the power cord can access a pre-existing power outlet elsewhere in the room by way of knock-out openings located on either side of the backing plate. See "Figure 35: Knock-out for power cord." on page 19.





Figure 3: Minimum openings.

The Tofino Gas inserts are certified to be installed into pre-existing approved fireplace. The minimum existing opening fireplace requirements are listed in Figure 3 below.

Before installing the Tofino inserts, have the chimney and fireplace swept including ash dumps and clean outs. Clean and remove any creosote and soot residue that may cause odors and stains after the insert has been installed. The fireplace chimney should be in good working order and made of non-combustible material. Make sure chimney clean-outs fit properly.

When preparing an existing fireplace to install a gas insert, any modifications that will compromise the integrity of the existing fireplace are not allowed. To make way for the inserts' venting, the fireplace flue dampener may be blocked open or removed. Refractory, glass doors, screen rails, screen mesh and log grates can be removed from the fireplace before installing the insert. Also, smoke shelves, shields and baffles may be removed if attached by mechanical fasteners. Cutting any sheet metal parts of the fireplace, in which the gas fireplace insert is to be installed, is prohibited.

If the factory-built fireplace has no gas access hole(s) provided, an access hole of 1.5" dia. (37.5mm) or less may be drilled through the lower sides or bottom of the firebox in a proper workmanship like manner. This access hole must be plugged with non-combustible insulation after the gas supply line has been installed.





Horizontal Clearances




Figure 5: Horizontal clearance to combustibles.

Adjustable Leveling Bolts




Figure 6: Leveling adjustments.

This fireplace comes with two leveling bolts used to adjust the angle of the front of the fireplace relative to the wall in which it's installed (Figure 6). The bolts are preinstalled. There is also a single rear leveling adjustment bolt located at the center of the bottom floor. Use these adjustments along with the bubble sight (Figure 7) to level the Tofino fireplace.

Removable Handles

The handles used to lift and maneuver the Tofino into position can be removed in order to accommodate a narrower horizontal fireplace opening. By removing each of the two handles, a full 1 1/2" can be saved.




Figure 8: Removable handles.




Figure 9: Removable handle screws.



Installation Advisory

The i30 comes from the factory with a 3" intake and a 4" exhaust configuration. Whenever possible, this configuration should be used. However, a 4" to 3" optional reducer (Figure 11) can be used on the exhaust for venting lengths between 10' and 28' if necessary. Be advised that using this optional adapter may have an impact on flame appearance and is not recommended for use with the glass burner option while operating with propane gas.

Installation Tip

Depending on the amount of room available for the installation of the Tofino, the installer may want to remove the flue adapter and attach it to the flex tubes which will have previously been inserted down the chimney. The installer must make sure that the air intake vent and air exhaust vents attach to the correct ports on both the flue adapter and the vent terminal. The vent terminal and the flue adapter are marked with an "I" (air intake) and "E" (air exhaust).

Optional 4" to 3" exhaust adapter

Part number for the optional 4" to 3" exhaust adapter is 1227.0003.




Figure 10: 4 x 3 inch Flue adapter.




Figure 11: 4 inch to 3 inch exhaust adapter.

- 1. Measure chimney height, cut flex liner (min.10') as required. Mark one pipe at both ends to identify combustion air intake pipe from flue outlet pipe.
- 2. Attach marked flex liner pipe to the intake side of vent terminal. Seal and secure with sealant and screws provided. Attach the other pipe to the outlet side of vent terminal. Seal and secure with sealant and screws provided.
- 3. Insert both flex liners from top of the chimney, down through the damper opening.
- 4. Attach and seal according to vent terminal manufacturers' instructions
- 5. For larger chimneys, a flashing may be cut and fitted to suit. Caulk the flashing in place to seal any gaps.




Figure 12: Flue adapter components.

Min. Vent Height 10' (3m)




Figure 13: Co linear venting.






Figure 14: SIT Proflame controller module.

The SIT Proflame controller (Figure 14) is used along with the SIT Proflame gas valve (See "Figure 39" on page 20). The use of the SIT Proflame controller requires a remote control device (provided) unique to the SIT Proflame configuration. Instructions for using the SIT Proflame remote control device are found Tofino Operating Instructions manual. The SIT module uses 4 AA batteries. The SIT Proflame remote control unit uses 3 AAA batteries.

Maxitrol Control Overview




Figure 16: Maxitrol module.

The Maxitrol controller (Figure 16) is used along with the Maxitrol gas valve (Figure 41 on page 21). The use of the Maxitrol controller requires a remote control device (provided) unique to the Maxitrol configuration. Instructions for using the Maxitrol remote control device are found in the Tofino Operating Instructions manual. The Maxitrol module uses 4 AA batteries. The Maxitrol remote control unit takes 2 AAA batteries.




Figure 18: Glass door and hooks.




Figure 20: Door handles in closed position.

Removal

- 1. Remove the decorative front and backing plate from the front of the fireplace, "Surround Installation/ Removal Instructions" on page 40. Take care to disconnect the wire on the left hand side of the backing plate which attaches the switch to the interior of the fireplace.
- 2. There are two handles located on the fireplace door (Figure 18) which must be pulled inward toward the center of the fireplace to unlock the door (Figure 19). This may take some effort because the door completes a tight seal around the firebox.
- 3. Remove the door and set aside.

Installation

- 1. Place the door over the opening of the fireplace.
- 2. There are two hooks on the top of the handles and two hooks on the bottom of the handle and so the door must be placed squarely over the firebox opening.
- 3. Once the glass door is seated, close the door handles outward and inward until they stop.
- 4. The handle will not close completely. There will be an approximately 3/4" gap between the handles and the door frame (Figure 20). This is normal.
- 5. Return the backing plate to its original position making sure to reconnect the switch wire to the backing plate. Return the surround to its original position.



Panel Installation

The panel sets are delicate and should be handled with care.

The baffle and panel support bracket (Figure 22) retains the side panels, supports the front end of the ceramic glass baffle, and has a shield which directs the light from the ceiling of the firebox (available on i30s models only) down onto the log set (model dependent). It is held in place by two bolts. The bracket and its bolts should be removed before installing the rear and side panels so that the bolts protruding from the ceiling do not damage the panels.




Figure 23: Perforated panel tab.

Note: The baffle and panel bracket (Figure 22) has a perforated tab at each end (Figure 23). This allows the tabs to be easily bent against the decorative side wall panels to hold them in place if necessary. Use only enough force to hold the panel in place and not so much as to damage the panel.




Figure 24: Baffle and panel bracket supporting side panels.




Figure 25: Rear wall showing panel support posts.






Figure 26: Rear panel in place.

Installation

- 1. With the above mentioned support bracket and bolts removed, hang the rear panel onto the posts protruding from the rear wall (Figure 25 and Figure 26).
- 2. Gently place the base of either of the two side panels along the edge of the firebox floor and wall. Then slowly tilt the top part of the panels up into the edge of the wall and ceiling. Be careful that the top corner of the panel closest to the front of the fireplace makes as little contact with the opening edge of the firebox (Figure 27) as this may damage the panel.
- 3. The rear panel is stabilized once the side panels are in place. Stabilize the side panels by installing the glass baffle and panel bracket (Figure 22) and its bolts.
- 4. Install the ceramic glass baffle as outlined in "Installing the ceramic baffle:" on page 18.





Figure 28: Right side panel in place.




Figure 30: Ceramic glass baffle.

The baffle is made of ceramic glass which allows for the use of a halogen lamp feature. The halogen lamp is only available on units using the SIT Proflame configuration, the Maxitrol configuration does not include the use of a halogen lamp.




Figure 32: Raising baffle above front support.

Installing the ceramic baffle:




Figure 33: Sliding baffle over to rest on top of supports.

- 1. With the door removed, place one end of the baffle over one of the two upper corners so that the baffle is resting on a rear peg and a front support (Figure 31).
- 2. Raise the opposite end of the baffle so that it is raised above the supports on the other side of the firebox (Figure 32).
- 3. Slide the baffle over so that it is supported by all four supports (Figure 33).

Cleaning the ceramic glass baffle:

Note: Do not clean the ceramic glass baffle until the fireplace has been turned off long enough for the glass door and ceramic baffle to sufficiently cool down. It is not necessary to remove the ceramic baffle in order to clean it but the ceramic baffle is easily removed. Use glass cleaner to clean the ceramic baffle of soot or other debris.


Figure 34: Electrical connection.

Note: SIT controlled installations require that an electrical outlet be installed either into an existing fireplace cavity before the Tofino is installed, or alternatively, the power cord can access a pre-existing power outlet elsewhere in the room by way of knock-out openings located on either side of the backing plate (Figure 35).

NOTE: The appliance, when installed must be electrically grounded in accordance with local codes or, in the absence of local codes, with the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70, or the Canadian Electrical Code, CSA C22.1.

Caution: The gas line should be installed by a qualified service person in accordance with all building codes. This section is intended as a guide for qualified technicians installing this appliance. Consult local and/or national building codes before proceeding.

- Gas supply line connection is located on the left rear side of the insert (Figure 36). Gas connection accepts a 3/8" N.P.T. fitting. Correct gas line diameter must be used to assure proper operation and pressure. **Do not use external threads for gas connections. Use internal threads only.**
- A drip leg must be installed in the gas supply line close to the appliance to minimize the possibility of any loose scale or dirt within the gas supply line from entering the control valve.

Check local codes for additional requirements. Turn on the gas supply and check that all connections are tight and leak free.




Figure 38: SIT control center.




Figure 40: Maxitrol electrical controller in its caddy.




Figure 41: Gas valve for Maxitrol configuration.

Gas Pressure Testing Procedure

Note: This section covers gas pressure testing for both SIT and Maxitrol gas valves.

Note: To test the gas pressure, turn off the gas supply to the appliance before loosening test point screws. Verify gas pressures with the fireplace lit and at the highest setting.

- 1. Remove surround.





Figure 42: Gas valve location.

- 2. Locate the inlet and outlet test points on the valve which can be seen in (Figure 42). After locating test ports loosen the cap ends within the ports using a 3/16" Allan key.
- If necessary, attach brass test extensions to the test ports. Extensions are not included (Figure 44). 3.
- Attach one end of hoses to brass extensions and the other end to the pressure gauge. 4.
- Turn gas supply back on and test pressures. 5.
- 6. After testing is finished turn off gas supply, remove the pressure gauges, apply thread sealant to cap ends and re-tighten (Figure 45).




Figure 43: Gas pressure test ports.




Figure 46: Damper adjustment.

Note: Be aware that the damper adjustment mechanism may be hot if the fireplace has been burning for any length of time.

Tofino fireplaces come with an adjustable vent damper. This damper is located behind the air deflector at the rear of the inner firebox. Sometimes on installations that involve vertical venting configurations over 10 feet in height (10 feet is the minimum height), the intake air tends to accelerate down the vent causing hectic flame action. This damper can be closed partially to reduce the speed of the intake air and thus calm the flames to a more natural look. Over-closure of this damper could cause an insufficient air supply to the fire, which would result in flames that cause soot.

Damper Adjustment:

To adjust the damper, locate the bolt (10 mm or Phillips) on top of the fireplace at the front. Loosen it and adjust the lever directly below the bolt and guide label (Figure 46).

- To close the damper (for a 40' flue), push the adjustment mechanism away from you.
- To open the damper (for a 10' flue), pull the adjustment mechanism toward you.




Figure 48: Tofino venturi adjustments.




Figure 50: Venturi opened.

The Tofino has two burners and therefore, two venturis. The venturis are easily accessible and adjustable without having to remove the door.

To adjust the venturis:

- 1. With the fireplace turned off, check that the surround is cool to the touch.
- 2. Remove the surround from the fireplace.
- 3. With the fireplace turned on, use the adjustments to adjust for flame appearance.

Note:

The venturi settings on the Tofino i30 units come preset from the manufacturer. Units that use natural gas come with the venturi adjustment set at the fully closed position while units that are configured for propane gas have their venturi adjustment set at the fully open position. It may be necessary for the installer to make a minor adjustment, whether using a natural gas model or a propane gas model, to achieve the desired flame pattern and/or to eliminate sooting.



Glass Media Installation




Figure 51: Glass burner tray and screw down points.

- 1. With the interior panels and the ceramic glass baffle installed, place the burner tray (Figure 51) inside and over the burners and secure in place (total of 10 screws to be used). Place the decorative front edge plate (Figure 52) so that it hooks over the edge of the burner tray. This plate does not fasten to anything and simply rests in place.




Figure 54: Crushed glass layer.

- 2. Add a thin layer of crushed glass on top of the burners and the burner tray (Figure 54). When placing the crushed glass on the burner tray, leave enough room around the pilot and rectifier flame so that it is not impeded. Avoid dumping entire contents of bag onto the burner tray as fine glass particles at the bottom of the bag can block burner ports and hamper the function of the venturi mechanism.
- 3. Keep the gap between the two burners free from all crushed glass (Figure 54). This gap is required for air flow.




Figure 61: Log number 6.

Log set Installation

Note: Panel set must be installed before the Split log set installation begins.




Figure 64: Ember pieces retainer and air deflector-1st log support.





Figure 66: Gap between air deflector and burner.

- 1. Begin by placing the air deflector / 1st log support (Figure 64) behind the rear burner and up against the rear wall (Figure 65). Position so that the lip faces toward the front of the fireplace. Fasten the deflector down with supplied screws. Once the deflector is secured, there should be a gap of approximately 1/2 inch between the deflector and the rear burner (Figure 66). This gap is required for air flow. Also secure the Ember pieces Retainer (Figure 64) along the back of the rear burner. This will help to keep the ember pieces from spilling over from the burner and down into the air gap.




Figure 67: Right side mesh guard.

- 2. Place the right side mesh guard (Figure 67) on the right of the burners and secure with supplied screws (Figure 68).




Figure 70: Front mesh guard in place.

- 4. Install the front base piece (Figure 55) as shown in Figure 71. Make sure that indent on the bottom inside edge fits over the pilot assembly.
- 5. Install the left side base piece (Figure 55) as shown in Figure 72.
- 6. Install the right side base piece on top of the right side mesh guard as shown in Figure 73. The base pieces, in addition to adding an aesthetic dimension to the overall appearance, help to complete an enclosure for holding the ember pieces / glowing ember material pieces on top of the burners (Figure 74). The two side pieces have one hole each to accept the posts protruding from the bottom of logs two and four.




Figure 75: Support spacer over post.




Figure 77: Log one position on air deflector - 1st log support.

- 7. Place included metal spacer/support over top of the left-hand side post located on the front burner (Figure 75). This spacer will support the front tip of log number two. **Note: Spacer may already be present and pre-fastened to the burner.**
- 8. Place the number one log on top of the air deflector / 1st log support (Figure 76) making sure that the back side of this log is up against the rear wall (Figure 77).




Figure 79: Ember pieces surrounding pilot.




Figure 80: Air gaps.

- 9. Distribute a thin layer of ember pieces (Figure 62) onto the front and rear burner trays (Figure 78). Place extra ember pieces on the thin, but noticeable gaps between the front base piece and the two side base pieces (Figure 79). Keep the ember pieces from interfering with the pilot assembly. Keep the ember pieces from falling into the air gaps between the front and rear burners and the gap between the rear burner and the air deflector which supports the first log (Figure 80).




Figure 81: Log 2 positioned on spacer.

- 10. Place log number two (Figure 57) so that the post protruding from the bottom of the log can be inserted into the hole of the left base piece. Then position the front tip of the log so that it rests on top of the spacer (Figure 81). The log and the ember pieces should ideally hide the spacer.




Figure 82: Log 3 placement and location post for log 4.

- 11. Place log number three (Figure 58) so that the post protruding from the bottom of the log can be inserted into the hole of the right-hand base piece. Then position the front of the log so that it rests on top of the center base piece (Figure 82). The front tip of the log should be very close to, or just touching, the center base piece.




Figure 83: 4th log placement.

- 12. There is a location post on top of the 3rd log (Figure 82) that is used to accommodate a slot located on the bottom of the 4th log (Figure 59). Place the 4th log's slot on top of the 3rd log's post. Position the front (or lower) end of the 4th log so that it sits on the rear edge of the front burner as shown in Figure 83.
- 13. Place the 5th log (Figure 60) so that the bottom end of the log rests against the right wall panel and on top of the front base piece. Position the upper end so that the longer branch is cradled in the crook of the 4th log (Figure 84). Position the lower end so that it is on top of the front base piece close to where the door glass will be.




Figure 85: 6th log placement and ember wool distribution.

- 14. Place the 6th log (Figure 61) so that the top end rests on top of the 2nd log and the bottom end rests against the left wall panel and left base piece (Figure 85). The bottom end should be close to the front edge of the left base piece but not so close that it will be disturbed when re-installing the fireplace door.
- 15. Left over ember pieces can be used to hide the edges of the base pieces in addition to placing some on top of the base pieces if desired.
- 16. Gently pull apart the individual pieces of the ember wool (Figure 63) so that they are not compressed or compacted and spread them in front of the logs to finish (Figure 85).

Manual Switch Installation for SIT Units

The manual ON/OFF switch for the fireplace comes semi-installed (Figure 87). All that is needed is to install the switch itself to the surround backing plate.

To install ON/OFF Switch




Figure 86: SIT manual switch connection at SIT module.

1. Check that the ON/OFF Switch cable is plugged into the SIT module (jack X8) as shown in Figure 86.

Note regarding batteries for the SIT module (Figure 86): Installation of batteries for the SIT module are not necessary if the fireplace is connected to AC power. Batteries are only used if the fireplace is not connected to AC power and as a backup against power failure.

2. With the surround backing plate positioned in front of the fireplace, position the switch in behind the open slot in the backing plate and screw into place Figure 88.




Figure 90: Switch connector at control module.




Figure 93: On Off switch location for Maxitrol units.



Pairing the SIT Remote Handset and Receiver




Figure 94: SIT module battery holder.

- 1. Install 4 AA batteries into the battery holder located behind the electronic control module on the pull out caddy (Figure 94). Note: Batteries are not required if the fireplace is connected to an AC power source.
- 2. Install 3 AAA batteries into the SIT remote handset (Figure 95)
- 3. Plug the power cord into the Tofino and open the gas supply line.




Figure 96: Program button.

- 4. With the decorative front and backing plate (Figure 100 and Figure 101) removed, press the button marked "PRG" on the caddy and press the program button once (Figure 96). The module will beep 3 times indicating that it is ready to synchronize with the remote handset.
- 5. On the remote handset, push the power on button once. The remote handset will beep 4 times to indicate that the remote handset and the control module are now synchronized. The remote handset is now ready to use.

Pairing the Maxitrol Remote Handset and Receiver —







Figure 97: Maxitrol receiver module.

- 1. Insert batteries four double "AA" batteries into the receiver module (Figure 97).
- 2. Install 3 AAA batteries into the Maxitrol remote handset (Figure 98).




Figure 101: Backing plate.

- 3. The receiver must learn the handset code: Remove the decorative front followed by the backing plate (Figure 100 and Figure 101). Locate the module caddy on the left-hand side of the fireplace. The reset button is located here (Figure 99).
- 4. Press and hold the receiver's reset button (Figure 99) until you hear two (2) beeps. After the second, longer beep, release the reset button. Within the subsequent 20 seconds press the "ARROW DOWN" button on the handset until you hear two (2) short beeps confirming the code is set. The remote handset is now ready to use.

NOTE: This is a one time setting only, and it is not required when changing the batteries in the handset or receiver.

Installation

- 1. Attach the ON/OFF Switch face plate to the backing plate before seating the backing plate onto the fireplace.





Figure 102: Mounting the backing plate.

- 2. Place the backing plate onto the fireplace by inserting its four hooks into the four slots on the fireplace frame (Figure 102).
- Install the decorative front by inserting its four hooks into the corresponding slots on the backing plate (Figure 103).

Removal

Removal is the reverse of installation.

Maintenance

CAUTION:

Turn off gas and electrical power supply (if applicable) and allow ample time for unit to cool before servicing appliance. It is recommended that the fireplace and its venting should be inspected at least once a year by a qualified service person.

Glass Door:

Warning: Do not operate fireplace with glass door removed, cracked or broken. Replacement of the glass door should be done by a licensed or qualified service person.

Do not strike or otherwise impact the glass in anyway that may cause it to break. If the glass becomes cracked or broken it must be replaced before using the fireplace. Replacement door can be obtained from your nearest Pacific Energy Fireplaces dealer. The size required is dependent on which version of Tofino is installed. Use original Tofino door only. Do not substitute with any other type.

To remove broken glass, remove door frame as noted in See "Door Installation/Removal" on page 15.

Install the new door onto the fireplace.

Annual Inspection:

- a) Remove glass door and inspect if soot buildup is present. Inspect the burner assembly and the ceramic glass baffle for soot buildup. If excessive buildup of soot is present, have a qualified service person inspect and adjust unit for proper combustion. Clean logs and burner with a brush or vacuum cleaner, paying close attention to burner ports.




Figure 106: Maxitrol pilot.

- b) Check the pilot system for proper flame size and operation. Clean pilot free of soot, dust or any other deposits (Figure 105 and Figure 106). Have a qualified service person adjust the pilot flame.
- c) Check that the vent pipe and vent terminal are open and free from blockage or debris. If the venting is disassembled for cleaning, it must be properly assembled and re-sealed. See Venting section in Installation manual proper procedure.
- d) Check glass panel gasket, replace the door if necessary.It is important that the glass seal be maintained in good condition.
- e) Check and replace batteries as needed.


Note: The appliance area must be kept clear and free from combustible materials, gasoline and other flammable vapours and liquids.

Periodically:

- a) Viewing glass may be cleaned as necessary with fireplace glass cleaner.
- b) Exterior finish may be cleaned with mild soap and water.

CAUTION:

Do not use abrasive cleaners on glass or any other part of the fireplace. Do not clean glass when hot.




Figure 107: SIT wiring diagram.






Figure 108: Maxitrol wiring diagram.
